Camp Themes

June 16-20

Morning: Art FUNDamentals

In the morning, explore the fundamental elements of art like color, line and shape and learn the lingo of art by exploring drawing, painting, printmaking, sculpture and collage projects. A variety of playful projects will bring the fundamentals of art to life!

Afternoon: Drawing

Learn drawing fundamentals and explore new techniques through a variety of projects and activities inspired by artwork in our *Heroes Aren't Hard to Find* comic art exhibit!

June 23-27

Morning: Visual Storytelling

Drawing inspiration from our comic book exhibition, *Heroes Aren't Hard to Find: The Comic Art Collection of Shelton Drum*, campers will use theater games and activities to develop their own characters and stories and then bring them to life through a variety of visual art projects.

Afternoon: Painting

Explore the wonderful world of paint! We'll paint with unusual objects, learn new techniques and use different types of paint in our projects.

July 7-11

Morning: The Nature of Art

An exploration of the ways that nature can inspire, influence and help us create art. In the mornings, campers will take nature walks through our Sculpture Garden, collect objects to use in sculpture and collage projects, paint with water and earth and create sun prints.

Afternoon: Photography

Campers will be introduced to the basics of photography in its simplest forms. We'll leave behind the smart phones and digital cameras and learn how to create photographs using just light and photo paper, build our own pinhole cameras and much more!

July 14-18

Morning: Monster Madness

Invent your own monsters, aliens and creatures and bring them to life through a variety of art projects. We will visit WKMA's Patch Whiskey mural and draw inspiration from Patch's world of colorful (and completely friendly!) monsters.

Afternoon: Printmaking

Campers will love the elements of surprise inherent in printmaking. Instructors will lead students through an introduction of printmaking basics and introduce several techniques for creating their own printing plates and finished works of art.

July 21-25

Morning: Puppetpalooza

Hand puppets, shadow puppets, giant puppets, puppets, puppets, and more puppets! Campers will bring their own creatures and characters to life through the many forms of puppetry, and then try their hand at puppeteering by creating their own puppet shows.

Afternoon: Sculpture

Explore several types of sculpture and building in art, including clay, found object, assemblage, and paper mache. Campers will learn the fundamentals of sculpture, including building their own armatures as the foundation for their own works of art. We will visit the WKMA Sculpture Garden and the galleries to see examples of sculpture materials and techniques.

July 28 - August 1

Morning: So Surreal!

Delve into the fantastical world of Surrealism! Campers will learn about the artists who started the surrealist movement and explore their fantastical creations. Drawing on famous works for inspiration, campers will create their own dreamscapes, create fantastical creatures and much more!

Afternoon: Mixed Media

Campers will enjoy the creative freedom that comes with mixed media art projects while learning methods and techniques that can be used in all sorts of projects. Combining drawing, painting, photography, printmaking, and even sculpture, campers will create paintings, collages, and assemblages using their new skills.
