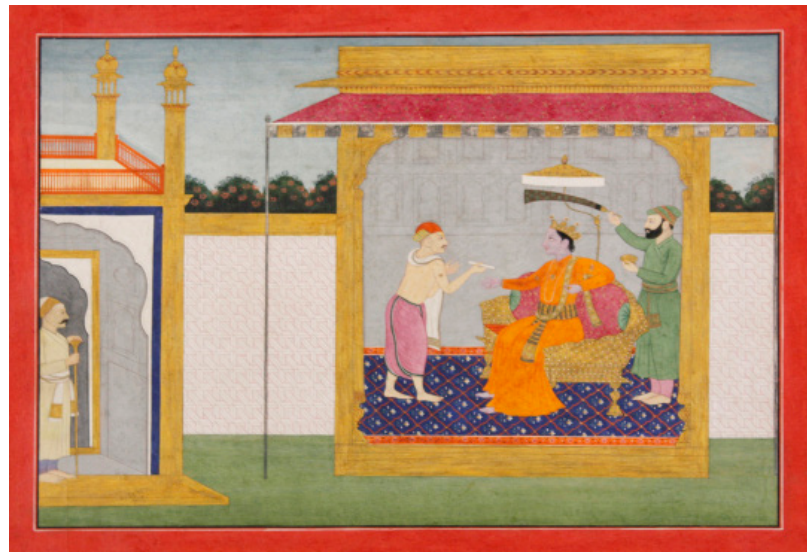

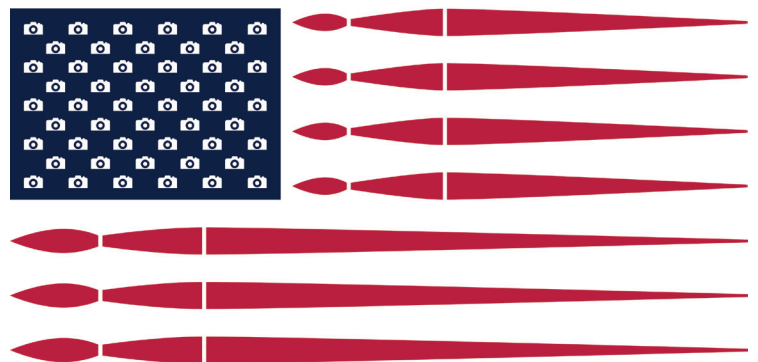

## SENIOR STUDENTS COLLEGE FOR OLDER ADULTS

Curator-guided tours coupled with hands-on art activities related to each exhibition is the theme for William King Museum of Art's fall classes. Four very different exhibitions will provide a varied course of learning: *Allegory of No Region* features contemporary artist Bill Rutherford's large, colorful canvases packed with tidbits of literary allusions; *Realms of Earth and Sky* introduces paintings from Indian history; *Cherry Bounce*, just in time for the elections, will be a lively look at American presidential politics through the years; and the old-time photography process of Cyanotypes in the works of local artist Jocelyn Mathews.

The museum lost two good friends of the Cultural Heritage Project recently. Mary Belle (Mrs. Glenn C.) Price died on August 11 at the age of 98. Mary Belle was intensely interested in promoting an appreciation of the region's decorative arts history. Her gifts funded our original Cultural Heritage gallery as well as our book, *Great Road Style: The Decorative Arts Legacy of Southwest Virginia & Northeast Tennessee*. Both gifts were made in memory of her husband, Glenn C. Price.

Marcus F. King died on August 18. He was the principal field researcher for the Cultural Heritage Project. Marc traveled over 30,000 miles through fifteen counties and documented more than 2000 objects made during the 19th century in Southwest Virginia & Northeast Tennessee. These survey records form the foundation of the Cultural Heritage Archive. He remained closely associated with the Project until his death, providing countless hours of collaborative study with the Project team. -Betsy K. White, Director
